Following service as a House of Councillors member and Senior Vice Minister of Education, has become a leading figure in education and sport policy. Led discussions on the revised Basic Act on Sport.

Olympic gold medalist (rowing, 1964 Tokyo) with over 50 years leading Canadian sport, including as founding CEO of Own the Podium and a 30-year IOC consultant supporting Japan's Olympic and Paralympic programs.

Professor, Waseda University

Leads the development of international sport talent through partnerships across Asia. Researches and practices Sport for Tomorrow (SFT) and sport diplomacy.
